At a tender age of six she started performing and at eight she had her first stage performance. She inherits the voice of her



grandmother late Chitra Rakshit (Kinna Datta), a famous Bhajan singer, who's was play-back recorded in 1932 by Colmodia Company.

Haimanti is a singer by training. She began taking proper lessons from Ustad Bani Chowdhury. She also took lessons from Ustad Nirod Boron Barua, Basudev Ghose, Sobhan Khan and Anup Barua.

Haimanti is popular for a bubbly, remix singer of popular, old-days songs. She gives a new colour and texture to the popular Bangla songs, both from Bangladesh and India. Because of her ability as a prolific singer she also surprises her audiences with occasional Urdu and Hindi delights.

Her first album (1995) was Dakpion, followed by Mone Pore Tomake (1998) and Premer Choya (2000). After that she went for many solo CDs and sung for many movies as a play-back singer.
